

Mandatory COVID-19 Information

Before you depart from Canada

1. As of June 20, 2022, vaccination is no longer required to board a plane or train in Canada.
 - This change does not affect border measures that require all travellers entering Canada to continue following entry requirements, including vaccination. For details, please visit:

 - Other public health measures, such as wearing a mask, continue to apply and will be enforced throughout a traveller's journey on a plane or train.
 - Given the unique nature of cruise ships, including the fact that passengers are in close contact with each other for extended periods of time, vaccination against COVID-19 is still required for passengers and crew on cruise ships.
 - Adherence to strict public health requirements on cruise ships will still be required.

Note that the documents required for the outbound portion of your travel may differ from those required for the return and whilst we are making our best efforts to keep the information on this page updated, due to fast-changing government mandates and restrictions we are not responsible for the accuracy of this information. We encourage all passengers to validate the information directly with the concerned governmental authorities (embassy, high commission or consulate of each country on your itinerary).

Failure to meet country entry requirements may result in long delays at the airport or upon arrival at your destination. Travellers may also be refused travel or be subject to government enforcement action for non-compliance.

Before your flight to Canada

ArriveCan

All travellers, with limited exceptions, whether entering Canada by air, land, rail or marine vessel, **must** use ArriveCAN.

1. Download the free ArriveCan App or sign in online:

2. You'll need to submit your information within 72 hours before your arrival to Canada to provide the following information:

- Mandatory contact information and travel details
- Vaccination information
- Quarantine plan (if required)

Before boarding a flight to Canada, fully vaccinated guests are required to provide evidence of COVID-19 vaccination to the Government of Canada via ArriveCAN. You may be contacted by the Government of Canada and provincial/territorial officers throughout your quarantine period.

3. Failure to submit the required information through ArriveCAN, may result in denied boarding if arriving by air or denied entry into Canada if crossing at a land, rail or marine border crossing.

Canadian citizens, permanent residents or persons registered under the Indian Act and foreign nationals eligible to enter Canada under another entry exemption (such as foreign work, study, compassionate grounds) will not be denied boarding or entry, but you:

- won't be eligible for the fully vaccinated traveller exemption
- may face additional delays at the border for public health questioning
- may be subject to fines or enforcement action

Mandatory COVID-19 Pre-Entry Testing Requirements for Canada

Pre-entry tests are no longer required for fully vaccinated travellers entering Canada by land, air or water. You must still use ArriveCAN within 72 hours before your arrival to Canada.

Unvaccinated and partially vaccinated children under the age of 12 are no longer required to provide a valid pre-entry test result, if they are accompanying a fully vaccinated adult.

Children who are less than 5 years old are not required to test, regardless of their vaccination status.
